Notable cases:

Bridgend County Borough council v Upper Bay Limited (2008) – Prosecution of Swimming Pool Company for alleged breach of duty to child under Section 3, HSAWA 1974. Near drowning led to catastrophic brain injury. Trial commences 5 November 2008.

Regina v Chambers, Cradley Electrical and Wilsons Transport – reckless manslaughter. Implication of companies. Health and Safety.

Regina v Chatfield and Chandler – joint prosecution by Her Majesty's Customs & Excise and Inland Revenue. Car importing and evasion of duty and Corporation Tax. Ongoing.

Regina v Psaila and others – Prosecution of witnesses involved in the Lynette White murder tried in South Wales
